Lets Begin! Why Band?!

- Congratulations on your choice of selecting one of the most elite groups on any middle, high school, or collegiate campus across the country.
- Music students consistently score higher on SAT, ACT, have higher graduation and GPA rates, are more likely to study at a higher education institution.
 - This is because music activates many areas of the brain at the same time. To simplify: Math (rhythm) and counting is used all the time which activates the left side of the brain, and Reading/Language (notes and pitch) activates the right side of the brain. Both are vital in a successful performance
 - Most importantly, music teaches us how to be passionate and learn about our aesthetic feelings – which grows all parts of the brain that is normally rarely activated and grown by other non-art related activities.

- Band fees go to pay for guest clinicians, MPA and Solo and Ensemble Registration Fees, new music, instrument repairs and supplies, new instruments, bus transportation fees, and a myriad of other costs incurred.




- We have already begun instrument introductions and testing in class on Flute and Clarinet...
- ..and will continue to introduce on Oboe/Bassoon, Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Tuba in class over the next few days.
- Students will get to play each instrument listed above for about 5-10 minutes.
- Students will receive about 1-2 minutes of one-on-one instruction from Mr. Autrey during this time.

A little note about Instrument Selection.....

- This happens every year:
 - 6 out of ten students want to play percussion.
 - 3 out of ten students want to play saxophone or trumpet.







About 120 beginners this year....

· Okay Math experts....here's your chance to shine....

• ...60% of students wish to take percussion as their choice....that would make _____ percussionists if they all got their way.

- Now parents....imagine the band concert with 78 percussion....and 52 wind players.....
- Yikes!

Please understand.

- We want your child to enjoy his or her band experience at Milwee MS.
- We want to have a very successful band program here at Milwee MS.

 Simply put – we cannot have both, if every student were able to get their number one choice of instrument.

Keep an Open Mind!

- Your son or daughter might "know" exactly what they want to play – that's awesome!!!
- However, some other factors might inhibit their ability to succeed on that instrument. Some students have various facial features that lend themselves to sound great on certain instruments, and less than great on others – perfectly normal!
- Please try to keep an open mind about instrument selection. The decision is a combination of the student ability, student interest, parental input, and professional input.
 - Professional input includes outside instructors and Mr. Autrey

Instrument Selection Night

- ie. "Instrument Petting Zoo Night"
 - Thursday, August 18st in the MLMS Cafeteria.
 - Starts at 6pm with 3rd period students
 - 6:45pm with 6th period students
 - 7:30pm with 4th period students
 - Stagger Entrances to avoid a rush or build up of lines on each instrument section.

Procedures

- Check-in with Mr. Autrey at the main table to receive your Testing Form.
- Fill out your name, and other information listed.
- With parent, visit instrument stations which are manned by professional musicians who will test each student on the instrument and give recommendations to Mr. Autrey on your form.
- Please be patient as each student will take about 1 to 2 minutes per instrument per station.
- It helps to look around to stations that have less lines....usual big line offenders are Trumpet and Clarinet....but French Horn, Oboe, Bassoon, Tubas have generally small lines (most of the time!)

Procedures, Page 2

- Students MUST:
 - Try at least 3 Woodwind, and 3 Brass Instruments
 - The Stations are:
 - · Woodwind: Flute, Clarinet, Oboe, Bassoon
 - Brass: Trumpet, French Horn, Trombone, Baritone, Tuba

Students will receive comments and a score per instrument tested. Please do not read into a certain score as it is only one component of the instrument selection process. Ie. A "TEN" doesn't mean they will get that instrument for sure.

Procedures, Page 3

- All done with at least 6 stations? (students can try them all, though!)
- At the bottom of the form, fill out the section that asks the student to list their top three instruments. There must be at least one brass, and one woodwind instrument out of those three choices.
- 98% of the students will get one of those three choices. The remaining 2%, I will call personally to speak to those individual students and parents to work something out the next day.

Bottom Line:

Mr. Autrey will have the final say on all instrument selection choices.

Noticed I haven't Mentioned....

- Percussion?
 - And for a good reason!
 - Only 2-3 students will be selected for percussion, per beginner class. (Remember that comic, earlier!)
 - Percussion selections will be based on student classroom conduct and a rhythmic ability assessment
 - The percussion assessment took place yesterday Monday, in class. The assessment will be administered by the Milwee Middle and Lyman High School percussion instructor: Heather Thorn.

Okay! Testing Over...what next!?

- Testing and the "Petting Zoo" takes place on Thursday, AUGUST 18th.
- Rental Night will be the following week on Tuesday, AUGUST 23rd at 6:30pm in the MLMS Cafeteria
 - This is a great opportunity to open a rent-to-own program with a highly reputable and reliable music store in Seminole County: Music Shack.

Rental Night

- Your student will receive their instrument choice in class on Monday, August 21st.
- Music Shack will present a meeting which will outline the various instrument rental agreements. They will also have an accessories table on hand for you to get all of the additional items needed.
- Information about what accessories each instrument needs can be found on page 12 in the MLMS Band Handbook
- The meeting should be very brief, with lots of Music Shack staff on hand everyone should be done by 7:45pm.

Rentals

• Instruments Rented through Music Shack will be delivered within 2 days!

- Some students may wish to rent larger instruments through the school please understand that supplies are very limited. However, we do have LOTS of TUBAS ⊚
- Lots....and lots of TUBAS ©

School Rentals

- Students who rent an instrument through the school must pay a non-refundable \$100 per full school year in order to rent an instrument.
 - Checks can be made out to "Milwee Spartan Band Boosters"
- This helps defray the cost of normal wear-and-tear of the instrument. We do repair these instruments at no cost to the student for normal wear-and-tear repairs.
- Students who neglect to take care of their instrument, cause serious harm outside of normal use, bend or dent, or lose their instrument will be liable to replace or pay for any repair costs incurred.
- This is mostly a need-based service, we will take into consideration all financial situations before deciding about renting school owned instruments.
